Panel topics include:

First Feminists- Lucinda Hinsdale Stone, Caroline Bartlett Crane, Sojourner Truth, Nannette B. Gardner, Ida E. Ginsburg, Lucy Thurman, Clara Arthur

1900s- Victorian Era, Curling Club, farming, Women’s Christian Temperance Union, Valerie Lipczynski (Polish immigrants), Annie Edison Taylor (went over Niagara Falls in a barrel), Michigan Nurses Association, Bina West Miller (Women’s Benefit Association)

1910s- Detroit Business Women’s Club, telephone operators, Harriet Quimby (1st female licensed pilot)

1920s- Flappers, 19th Amendment, Equal Rights Amendment (ERA), Eva McCall Hamilton, Cora Reynolds Anderson, YWCA, and Lena Cooper

1930s- Josephine Gormon, Detroit Housewives League, Jewish women’s consecration class, girls’ sports, Sara Van Hoosen, Grace Eldering, and Pearl Kendrick

1940s- Nancy Harkness Love (pilot), women recruited as “WINGS” to work at Olsmobile, Dora Stockman, Anne R. Davidow, Marjorie Peebles Meyers, All American Girl Baseball League, women workers, and Fran Harris

1950s- Ruth Thompson, Rachel Andersen, Cora Mae Brown, farm workers organizing boycotts, Waunetta Dominic, Gwen Frostic, and Rosa Parks

1960s- Second Wave of the Women’s Movement: Irene Clark Woodman, Elly Peterson, Jean King, Senator N. Lorraine Beebe, Patricia Hill Burnett, Martha Griffith, Equal Pay Act of 1963, and the Commission on the Status of Women

1970s- Violence against women, Marcia Federbush (Take Back the Night), Jan Bendor (Women’s Crisis Center), Virginia Nordby (Michigan Criminal Sexual Conduct Act), Master Lee Buesking (karate), the Clothesline Project

1980s- Mary Lou Butcher (Sexual Discrimination lawsuit), Marjorie Swank Matthews (1st female Bishop of the United Methodist Church), Jeanne Omelenchuk (1st woman to become a national champion in 2 sports), Erma Henderson (Detroit Common Council President), Genevieve Gillette (concervation), Shirley Schwartz (researcher for GM)
