Notes:

1) The exhibit, which occupies 90 linear feet of space, may be rented for a fee of **\$50 per week for a minimum of two weeks.**

2) All banners are for **INDOOR USE ONLY.**

3) All panels are framed and can be hung by nail on plastered walls. The frame and background of the panels are black; the photos and labels are sepia brown and beige.

4) The exhibit travels in one tube and three cases: the opening banner is stored in a tube, measuring 51” L x 3.5” in diameter; the text/photo banners are stored in three shipping cases, measuring 36.5” x 40.5”. The exhibit must be picked up from and delivered back to the Michigan Women’s Historical Center by minivan or covered pick-up truck at the renter’s cost.
